ONE WORLD (group show). Packing diverse styles, Chicagoans Stephanie Howard, Philip Jones and Susan McMillen wander the world with their cameras. Howard's Irish countryside, captured in sensitive, brooding black and white, is a somber place, dotted with graveyards and pastures filled with forlorn livestock. Jones's color takes of Asia spike the travel-magazine format with surprises; in Thailand, piles of blue jeans being readied for sale on Bangkok's streets dry on railroad tracks between lines of passenger cars. Susan McMillen steals the show with her funky studies of odd sights that transcend place; in "Behind the Restaurant," shot in Mali, a severed goat's head hangs from a noose in an alley. McMillen's most stunning image shows a row of statues of saints caught from behind on the roof of St. Peter's Basilica in the Vatican, standing like sentinels against a luscious muted purple, blue and pink evening sky.
